Discussion, Comments and Feedback after presentation:

Winter:

- Bicycling is used quite a bit in the spring, summer and fall but difficult in the winter when sometimes we can have snow 6 months out of the year.
- How long are people willing to walk in the sub-zero temperatures?
- Many students drive across campus and are willing to accept a ticket for a closer place to park. Some students carpool.
- The shuttle bus use is low until it gets really cold. Can be standing room only on the really frigid days.
 - However; if there are no shelters, customers are not willing to stand in the elements very long.

- Some see a disconnect on signage / lack of wayfinding for visitors, guests and parents. There should be clearer signage and more of an online presence.
- Working students-walking vs. driving
- Would more on campus Housing solve some of the parking issues?
- Should there be different systems/plans?
 - 1 for spring/summer/fall
 - 1 for winter (December-March)
- Attendance drops off for classes not requiring attendance
 - o Students don't want to walk or drive across campus and not find a parking spot
- There are more building connections "Hawk Walks" planned with construction that will help
- UPD and Parking Services spends much time "jump-starting" cars in -10 to -20 degree days.

Parking & Communications with Students:

- Suggestion that Parking work more closely with the Student Body to improve communications with students.
 - o Ex. during certain events, activities there might be a lack of Parking in . . .
 - Some students not even aware of shuttles and routes
 - Open House information sharing
 - Social Media postings / Real Time Information sharing (new app.?)
- Students think Parking Services can be "punitive"
- Students requesting more convenient locations
 - o More areas for parking in the central hub of campus
- More Educational Sharing opportunities / Marketing

The Parking Triangle / Tiered Parking

How to find the right balance between cost, proximity and availability. Usually a system can achieve only 2 of the 3 interests. If you want "free" parking it won't be convenient. If you want parking close and available it will be expensive.

- ? Are students willing to pay more for more convenient locations?
 - 3 Tiers: Silver, Gold, Platinum
 - Housing offered tiered parking and the closer and more expensive lots sold fast and there is a waiting list.
 - How equitable is that for student's/student's family that may not be able to afford?
- ? Priority of Customers: Students, Staff, Faculty, Guests

All Universities the size of UND charge for parking. Free Parking isn't Free. Need to keep the lots up to par – Who will ultimately pay for it?

- Students increase in fees?
- Housing increase in fees?
- Who would get priority in parking?

Certain areas of campus do have adequate parking in areas not in the core.

Guiding Principles:

- How to incorporate the Strategic Plan / Equity to all when not a clean line?
 - Senior Staff
 - o ADA
 - Income
- Need to explore options The Executive Council needs to make some difficult decisions
- How to get from one place on campus to another the best way and safely?
- Increase the time between classes?
 - o This would allow time for lots to empty and reload
